

NATIONAL RENEWAL

There is something in the human psyche that tends to favor independence and self-reliance when it comes to working through a problem. When all efforts are in vain some will seek outside assistance while others will doggedly persist in their endeavor to figure things out on their own. That illustrates the ancient history of the nation of Israel. They were drawn away from God by pagan practices and idol worship, but they continued in their sins trying to pretend they were still living under the covenant with the Lord God.

In the process of time Israel was permitted to have a king and natural leadership according to their desire to "be like all the nations" (1 Samuel 8:19-20). Eventually it was King Solomon that was allowed to build the Temple to be the center of worship for the nation. We say, "In God we trust," then banish Him from our schools and forbid His name to be mentioned in public ceremonies. We remove the cross from memorials and purge Christian symbols and references from our educational curriculum. Acknowledgment of God is reserved for the really big tragedies, the national catastrophes, when we sanctimoniously include a sympathetic phrase, "Our

prayers and our thoughts are with the victims."

It is time for a renewal of prayer and an acknowledgment that we have left God out of our most desperate hour. There are conditions for renewal and restoration. There must be a change of mind and heart for there ever to be a national blessing. Let us cling to the promise of Scripture as we, "Humble [our]selves and pray and seek [His] face and turn from [our] wicked ways." Even now we may hear from heaven and receive an intervention of the Holy One bringing righteousness and peace back to our nation.
