

LESSON 1 - IS HE ENOUGH?

He is My Provider and My Portion

And my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus.

Philippians 4:19

1. The definition for *Provider* is: one who makes available; one who supplies something that is wanted or needed.
2. The Hebrew word Jehovah Jireh means God will provide. It is used in Genesis 22:14 When God provided a lamb for the sacrifice in the place of Abraham's son, Isaac. And Abraham called the name of the place, The-Lord-Will-Provide; as it is said to this day, "In the Mount of the Lord it shall be provided."
3. The definition for *Portion* is: a reward, inheritance, share. It implies that God is something we come into rightfully as His heir.
4. Psalm 119:57 - You are my portion, O Lord; I have said that I would keep Your words.
5. Psalm 142:5 - I cried out to You, O Lord; I said, "You are my refuge, My portion in the land of the living. In other words, you are all I have in the land of the living (Common English Bible).
6. Lamentations 3:24 - "The Lord is my portion," says my soul, "Therefore I hope in Him!" The Lord is all I have. He is my only hope.
7. Philippians 4:19 - And my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus.
8. SHALL SUPPLY means You can be sure, God shall abundantly fill you up & satisfy all your needs.
9. ALL means leaving nothing out.
10. YOUR signifies close and personal.

11. NEED - Things you cannot live without.

12. What are some things we need?

13. ACCORDING TO HIS RICHES IN GLORY means the sky is the limit. Whatever you need, there is ample supply to fill that need. It won't run out. It won't be on back order. It is available here and now for you.

14. BY CHRIST JESUS - through Christ we have access to the riches in glory. Jesus made a way for us to be in relationship with Him and gives us the right to ask Him for anything we need.

15. Hebrews 11:40 - God having provided something better for us, that they should not be made perfect apart from us.

He is Mindful of Me

“Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by your name; You are Mine.

Isaiah 43:1

16. The Agnostic is one who believes in a higher power or there may be a god, but he doesn't have anything to do with us. This is a false theology. God is already involved in our lives.

He knows you by name.

17. What does Isaiah 43:1 say? “Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by your name; You are Mine. (Further study: 1 Timothy 3:16).

18. John 10:3 - To him the doorkeeper opens, and the sheep hear his voice; and he calls his own sheep by name and leads them out.

He thinks about you.

19. Jeremiah 29:11 - For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, says the Lord, thoughts of peace and not of evil, to give you a future and a hope. He not only thinks about us, but He has plans for us. He wants us to have peace, not evil, and a future and a hope.

Proverbs 8:23 - I have been established before there was even an earth

Isaiah 40:28-29 - The creator never faints or is weary. He gives power to the weak



He is Forever Faithful

If we are faithless, He remains faithful; He cannot deny Himself.

2 Timothy 2:13

20. Does it make God any less or more whether we believe in Him or not? Circle one: Yes or No. He is always God no matter what we think or do.
21. God's faithfulness is constant. No matter what we do or what we say, He remains faithful.
22. He is faithful forever. His faithfulness will never run out.
23. Hebrews 10:23 - Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful.
24. HOLD FAST means to hold on tenaciously.
25. TENACIOUSLY means to hold on tightly for a very long time, not letting go.
26. CONFESSION means to declare faith in something; to speak it or make known. To Hold Fast the Confession of our hope means - we will continue to speak of our hope in the reflection of His faithfulness, not in the reflection of what is going on around us.
27. WITHOUT WAVERING means no matter how strong the wind, it can blow, but it won't affect us. We won't be affected by others around us. We won't be swayed by other doctrines that don't align themselves with the Bible. It means being rooted in deep, so deep that nothing will uproot us.
28. We hold on with tenacious hope and do not waver because HE is faithful.

LESSON 2 - HE IS ENOUGH

1. What is a father? One who _____ me. Fill in the blank. Loves, protects, nurtures, believes in, provides for, etc.
2. Our earthly fathers may or may not fill all these expectations. It doesn't mean He is a bad father, it may just mean that He is human after all.
3. God is everything a father should be and then more. Why? Because God is not human, He does not forget, He doesn't make mistakes and He always comes through on His promises.
4. Matthew 6:26 - Look at the birds of the air, for they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?
5. Who is God's crown creation? mankind
6. If God is willing to take care of birds, is He then not willing to take care of his crown creation? Human beings?
7. Matthew 6:31-32 "Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For after all these things the Gentiles seek. For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things.
8. God is aware of our every need. When He compels us not to worry, it is because He will provide for us just as a Father should.
9. God is a good father. He is the perfect Father.
10. The ruler we use to measure what a good father is should be our Perfect Heavenly Father.
11. Isaiah 9:6 calls Him the Everlasting Father.
12. Luke 11:13 - If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him!"

He is My Shepherd

The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want.

Psalm 23:1

17. Psalm 22, 23 and 24 are considered the Shepherd Psalms.
18. Psalm 22 is about the Good Shepherd laying down His life for the sheep.
19. Psalm 23 is about the Great Shepherd who cares intensely for his sheep.
20. Psalm 24 is about the Chief Shepherd who is coming again.

As we go through Psalm 23, let us write down all the promises from our Great Shepherd.

21. The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want.
22. He makes me to lie down in green pastures
23. He leads me beside the still waters
24. He restores my soul
25. He leads in paths of righteousness for His name's sake.
26. Yea, though I walk through the shadow of death I will fear no evil
27. For you are with me;
28. Your rod and your staff they comfort me.
29. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies.
30. You anoint my head with oil
31. My cup runs over
32. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life
33. And I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever



He is My Redeemer

But now, thus says the Lord, who created you, O Jacob, And He who formed you, O Israel: “Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by your name; You are Mine.

Isaiah 43:1

34. To “redeem” is to make something that is bad or unpleasant better or more acceptable,
35. To Redeem is to exchange (something, such as a coupon) for money or a reward
36. To Redeem is to buy back
37. The definition of redeemer is: a person who brings goodness, or honor, to something again
38. A Redeemer is a person who redeems something
39. God is our redeemer
40. Isaiah 43:1 But now, thus says the Lord, who created you, O Jacob, And He who formed you, O Israel: “Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by your name; You are Mine.
41. Isaiah 54:4-6 - “Do not fear, for you will not be ashamed; Neither be disgraced, for you will not be put to shame; For you will forget the shame of your youth, And will not remember the reproach of your widowhood anymore. For your Maker is your husband, The Lord of hosts is His name; And your Redeemer is the Holy One of Israel; He is called the God of the whole earth. For the Lord has called you like a woman forsaken and grieved in spirit, like a youthful wife when you were refused,” Says your God.
42. 1 Corinthians 6:20 - For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God’s.
43. 1 Corinthians 7:23 - You were bought at a price; do not become slaves of men.
44. The story of Gomer and Hosea is one of the most beautiful love stories.

45. Although this story was a type of Israel and her adulterous relationship with God, it is also a beautiful type of a lover who will go to all lengths to redeem his beloved.
46. God told Hosea to marry a prostitute, Gomer. After she had a few children, Gomer goes back to her old lifestyle.
47. God gave Hosea such a deep love for Gomer that he buys her back and vows to love her and no other.
48. Hosea gave Gomer value when she didn't deserve it.
49. God's love for Israel is likened to Hosea's love for Gomer. Hosea redeemed Gomer, he paid a price to get her back.
50. Jesus Christ has paid the price of death on the cross for our sins. He bought us back when we were still in sin.
51. Galatians 4:4-6 - But when the fullness of the time had come, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, that we might receive the adoption as sons. And because you are sons, God has sent forth the Spirit of His Son into your hearts, crying out, "Abba, Father!"
52. Being our redeemer is another example of how precious we are to Jesus.
53. No one else can redeem us from sin.

Who is like You, O Lord, among the gods? Who is like You, glorious in holiness, fearful in praises, doing wonders?

Exodus 15:11

1. All of God's other attributes are stable and true because of His Holiness.
2. Exodus 15:11 Who is like You, O Lord, among the gods? Who is like You, glorious in holiness, Fearful in praises, doing wonders?
3. "Fearful in praises" also means awesome in praises.
4. Webster's dictionary defines Holy as: "exalted or worthy of complete devotion as one perfect in goodness and righteousness"
5. Holiness is an essential part of the nature of God.
6. The essence of God is holy.
7. God cannot be unholy. It is not his nature.
8. God's holiness is perfect freedom from all evil.
9. Because God is holy, He will never tempt you to sin. James 1:13 Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am tempted by God"; for God cannot be tempted by evil, nor does He Himself tempt anyone.
10. Since God is holy, we can be confident that His actions toward us are always perfect and just.
11. Holiness is the perfection of all His other attributes. God commands us to be holy.
12. Leviticus 19:2 "Speak to all the congregation of the children of Israel, and say to them: 'You shall be holy, for I the Lord your God am holy.'
13. Nothing unholy can come into God's presence. Sin separates us from Him.
14. The only way we can bridge that gap is to rid ourselves of sin.
15. God made a redemptive plan. His plan was to put on flesh, provide the perfect sacrifice and give Himself as the price for our sin.

He is My Comfort

You shall increase my greatness, and comfort me on every side.

Psalm 71:21

21. Isaiah 49:13 Sing, O heavens; and be joyful, O earth; and break forth into singing, O mountains: for the Lord hath comforted his people, and will have mercy upon his afflicted.
22. John 14:18 I will not leave you comfortless: I will come to you.
23. John 14:16 And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you forever;
24. Just like a big quilt you snuggle under when it is cold and stormy outside, Jesus will be your comforter when life sends a storm and you are afraid.
25. When the tears are falling, He will comfort us.
26. Matthew 5:4 Blessed are they that mourn: for they shall be comforted.
27. Psalm 23:4 Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me.
28. He comforts us when we are afraid.
29. Isaiah 51:12 “I, even I, am He who comforts you. Who are you that you should be afraid of a man who will die, and of the son of a man who will be made like grass?”
30. He says, “the son of a man who will be made like grass?” This means, the One who is able to comfort you is eternal. The man who makes you afraid is like grass that will wither away.
31. We don't have to be afraid when the Comforter is with us.



He is My Hiding Place

You are my hiding place; You shall preserve me from trouble; You shall surround me with songs of deliverance. Selah.

Psalm 32:7

32. In the midst of trouble, we can find a place in Him where we can sing a song of deliverance.

33. Genesis 19:10-11 10 But the men reached out their hands and pulled Lot into the house with them, and shut the door. 11 And they struck the men who were at the doorway of the house with blindness, both small and great, so that they became weary trying to find the door.

34. Psalm 119:114 You are my hiding place and my shield; I hope in Your word.

35. God will put up a wall, cause the enemy to go blind, or send them a different way when you are hiding in Him.

36. I find Safety and protection in my Hiding place.

37. He hides me from the attack of the enemy.

38. Isaiah 59:19 When the enemy comes in like a flood, The Spirit of the Lord will lift up a standard against him.

39. The spirit of the Lord will build a wall and create a Hiding place for you.

He is My Defender

The Lord will fight for you; you need only to be still.

Exodus 14:14 (NIV)

40. The definition of defend is to fight in order to keep (someone or something) safe; to not allow a person or thing to hurt, damage, or destroy (someone or something); to fight or work hard in order to keep (something, such as a right, interest, cause, etc.) from being taken away.

According to Exodus 14:13, Moses spoke to the Children of Israel before crossing the Red Sea (with the Egyptians on their backs and a sea in front of them).

41. First, He said, “don’t be afraid”

42. Secondly, to stand firm

43. And thirdly, that they would see deliverance from the Lord.

44. Exodus 14:14 (NIV) The Lord will fight for you; you need only to be still.

45. Sometimes God is trying to help us be calm and watch Him work.

46. Psalm 46:10 Be still and know that I am God.

47. We could also say, “Be still and trust that I am God.”

48. Stop thrashing about! Fighting against the enemy just wears you out.

49. Be still and remember this:

50. You can hear better when you are not thrashing.

51. You can think better when you are not afraid

52. You can know (or trust) better when you are thinking and listening.

53. When you have no one else fighting for you, remember God is a father to the orphan and a defender of widows.

According to Deuteronomy 1:30 here are three irrefutable promises:

54. The Lord is our God

55. He goes before us...he is already there

56. He fights for us...the champion is in our corner!
57. Joshua told the Children of Israel to be strong and courageous and NOT be afraid. For God is with you wherever you go.
58. We have this same promise. He will defend us. He will be with us wherever we go. No matter how weak you may feel or how strong the enemy is against you, Satan is no match for God!
59. 1 John 4:4 You are of God, little children, and have overcome them, because He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world.

Isaiah 40:28-31(NIV)

28 Do you not know? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom.

29 He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak.

30 Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall;

31 but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength.

They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.

- ◆ He is Holy - God's holiness makes all His other attributes stable and true.
- ◆ He is my comfort - Since God is the comforter, there is no one who can comfort like He does. He comforts me when I mourn - he dries my tears. He comforts me when I'm afraid and when I walk through the valley of the shadow of death.
- ◆ He is my Hiding Place - a safe place when the storm of life is raging.
- ◆ He is my Defender. When I'm in trouble, I will not be afraid. I will Stand firm and see_ the deliverance from the Lord. I shall be calm and watch Him work.

Do you feel like a bee yet? Knowing that you will fly because God created you to do so! He is enough! He is Holy and will keep His promises because He cannot be unfair. When the tears are falling and you feel alone, He will comfort you like no one else can. When you need a safe place to hide, He will be your hiding place. When you need a champion to fight for you, God will step up to the plate, flex His muscles, and win the battle for you. Yes, whatever your situation, He is enough!

Have you ever just felt weak?

60. Weak in your faith?

61. Weak in your walk with God?

62. Weak in your body?

63. Weak in your spirit?

64. Isaiah 40:29-31 He gives power to the weak, And to those who have no might He increases strength. Even the youths shall faint and be weary, And the young men shall utterly fall, But those who wait on the Lord Shall renew their strength; They shall mount up with wings like eagles, They shall run and not be weary, They shall walk and not faint.

65. It is possible to be able to fly when you feel the weakest.

66. It doesn't matter the age, the disability or the ability. God promised all of us that if we wait on Him, He would renew our strength.

67. Waiting is not rushing in. Waiting is being alert and controlled. Watching and waiting.

68. Proverbs 8:34-35 Blessed is the man who listens to me, Watching daily at my gates, Waiting at the posts of my doors. For whoever finds me finds life, And obtains favor from the Lord.

69. There are times when we tire of our weakness. Paul Prayed three times for his affliction to go away. He acknowledged that it was sent from Satan and he desperately wanted God to take it away. However, he also acknowledged that it may be a tool in God's hands to keep him humble.

70.2 Corinthians 12:9-10 - And He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness." Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon

me. Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in needs, in persecutions, in distresses, for Christ's sake. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

Catch the phrase: *MY strength is made perfect in weakness.*

Catch the phrase: *My grace is sufficient for you*

71. Whatever the source of our weakness, we can be assured that God's grace is sufficient.

72. Deuteronomy 33:26-27 "There is no one like the God of Jeshurun, Who rides the heavens to help you, And in His excellency on the clouds. The eternal God is your refuge, And underneath are the everlasting arms; He will thrust out the enemy from before you, And will say, 'Destroy!'

73. We cannot lean on this arm of flesh. It is weak at its strongest compared to God's strength.

74. When we feel weak, we must remember that His arms, His strength is everlasting. We can lean on them without fear.

75. What are some of our Weaknesses? temptation, sickness, lack of faith, vulnerable, spiritual disciplines, etc.

76. We all feel weak and vulnerable at times. Sometimes we don't know how fragile we are until that moment of temptation, testing, or lack of faith hits us. We don't have to fear those times. We trust Him and know that He gives strength to the weak.

77. Romans 8:26 Likewise the Spirit also helps in our weaknesses. For we do not know what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered.

78. The definition of *intercession* is: prayer, petition, or entreaty in favor of another ("Intercession." Merriam-Webster.com. Merriam-Webster, n.d. Web. 7 Apr. 2016.)

79. So when we don't even know how to pray, or how to put it into words, the Holy Ghost petitions for us. Speaking up for us to God.



He is My Healer

...For I am the Lord who heals you.

Exodus 15:26

80. Exodus 15:26 - If you diligently heed the voice of the Lord your God and do what is right in His sight, give ear to His commandments and keep all His statutes, I will put none of the diseases on you which I have brought on the Egyptians. For I am the Lord who heals you.
81. God reminded the Children of Israel that all those gods you left back in Egypt, were just images; they were just man-made trinkets and statues. He wanted them to realize that there is only One true living God.
82. Only a living God could heal their bodies.

Jesus is our Healer

83. Matthew 4:23 - And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing all kinds of sickness and all kinds of disease among the people.
84. There is no disease or sickness that God cannot heal.
85. Matthew 9:35 - Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every sickness and every disease among the people.
86. We can pray for the sick and they will recover because we have the spirit of the healer living in us through the Holy Ghost (Mark 16:16-18).
87. Acts 3:12 - So when Peter saw it, he responded to the people: "Men of Israel, why do you marvel at this? Or why look so intently at us, as though by our own power or godliness we had made this man walk?"
88. Acts 3:16 - And His name, through faith in His name, has made this man strong, whom you see and know. Yes, the faith which comes through Him has given him

(this man) this perfect soundness in the presence of you all. Jesus said He came in the father's name, so the Name they are speaking of is Jesus.

89. We are healed when we pray in Jesus Name and believe on His name.

He is the healer even if our sickness is unto death

90. We know that whatever the outcome, the glory of the Lord shall be our rear guard. If the light at the end of the tunnel is being with Jesus, He gives us the grace and hope to look forward to it. (Isaiah 58:8)

91. "Your righteousness shall go before you" (Isaiah 58:8). There is a reward in being faithful and trusting in the One who has redeemed you.

John 5:43 - Jesus came in the Father's name

Mark 16:17-18; Matthew 10:8; James 5:13-15 - We have power through the Holy Ghost to heal the sick.

He is My Peace

And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

Philippians 4:7

92. His peace is beyond our understanding.

93. His peace will keep your thoughts and hearts quiet and at rest.

94. Jesus is called the Prince of Peace. In other words, He rules peace. It is at His command (Isaiah 9:6).

95. Jesus rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Peace be still!" And the wind ceased and there was a **great calm** (Mark 4:39).

96. His peace is our ticket to calmness. He brings peace when we are troubled on every side.

According to www.livescience.com Michael Dickinson, a professor of biology and insect flight expert at the University of Washington "The whole question of how these little wings generate enough force to keep the insect in the air is resolved," Dickinson told Life's Little Mysteries. "There are details remaining, but it's just not an enigma anymore."

Dickinson published a 2005 study in the journal Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences on the flight of the bumblebee after gathering data using high-speed photography of actual flying bees and force sensors on a larger-than-life robotic bee wing flapping around in mineral oil. He says the big misconception about insect flight and perhaps what tripped up Magnan is the belief that bumblebees flap their wings up and down. "Actually, with rare exceptions, they flap their wings back and forth," Magnan said.
